Feedback from the stake holders

A. Alumni:

Members of the Alumni Association of Dalmia College, Rajgangpur wanted that the library should be computerised and the students and members of the staff be provided with internet access. They assured the Principal to provide all sorts of help to implement the programme. They had given emphasis on engaging more extra classes for weak students.

B. Parents:

The parents were happy to know that the college has initiated a computer programme in collaboration with Unitech as a service provider in the college campus. They were also satisfied to see the greenery in and around the campus. They wanted that more plantation be done in and around the campus and more drinking water facilities be created in the college to provide clean and pure water.

C. Employer:

The Managing Committee wanted the office to be fully computerised and asked the Principal to apply for funds to the UGC and the state Government for purchase of more computers and peripherals. They however expressed their satisfaction over the way the office is functioning. They also emphasized on providing basic computer training to the administrative staff of the office.

D. Students:

The students actively participated in the National Seminar held by the Science faculty on conservation of biodiversity and wanted that more seminars be held regularly so as to enable them to listen to learned speakers. They were also very enthusiastic about the steps taken for beautification of the campus and welcomed the idea of holding more extra classes for the weak students.

<u>Item No. 7.3</u> Details of two best practices followed by the institution:

It was felt that the students undergoing undergraduate courses should be provided with some vocational training/course with corporate exposure. Therefore, Diploma in Tourism was introduced for the Commerce students as add-on course with UGC assistance. This facility was availed by 70 students who completed the Certificate, Diploma and Advanced Diploma in Tourism. Further, feedbacks from the students are regularly collected to improve and bring in improvisation in classroom teaching.
